Carolyn Signorelli is currently with the General Litigation Section of the Office of the Attorney General handling civil rights and torts defense for the state. Her primary area of practice has been with the Child Protection Section, serving 19 years prosecuting child abuse and neglect cases in Superior Court for Juvenile Matters, handling numerous appeals, and leading its training program. In 2006, she was appointed Connecticut's first Chief Child Protection Attorney, where she spent 5 years heading a new agency charged with improving legal representation for children and indigent parents in child protection, custody, and support proceedings. With the help of the CBA and Judicial Branch, she established Child Welfare Law as a legal specialty in Connecticut. Attorney Signorelli has served on numerous task forces and committees, including the ABA's National Committee to Improve Parent Representation (2009 to 2011); the Children's Trust Fund (2004 – 2013), the Chief Justice's Public Service & Trust Commission as Co-Chair of the Demographics Committee; the Judicial Department's Court Improvement Project, and the Governor's Task Force on Justice for Abused Children (2006 – current). Attorney Signorelli is a member of the National Association of Counsel for Children and has taught public interest trial skills programs for NITA. She currently is a member of CBA's Appellate Advocacy, Child Welfare & Juvenile Law, and Human Rights & Responsibilities Sections. She received her B.A. from Vassar College with General and Departmental Honors and was the Mary Siegrest Hinz Fellow at William & Mary School of Law.
