- 1) Proposed legislative or regulatory concept: Proposal to amend Connecticut Business Corporation Act (CBCA) and Connecticut Revised Nonstock Corporation Act (CRNCA) to approve shareholder and member meetings on a virtual basis without a physical location, which will replace the Governor's Emergency Orders on the matter.
- 2) Explanation and rationale for advancing this position: Governor's Emergency Orders on the subject expire in February, and these amendments will add those provisions to the CBCA and CRNCA based on the comparable provisions of the ABA's Model Business Corporation Act (2016 Revision) and the current draft of the ABA Model Nonprofit Corporation Act.
- 3) Is draft regulation, legislation or proposed bill included? Yes.
- 4) What is the date of any legislative hearing, if known? Not known.
- 5) Was this position previously approved by the CBA? If so, when does/did it expire? No.
- 6) Is the CBA section or committee seeking to join a previously approved CBA section or committee position? No
