**Program Info:** To be eligible for CBA Law Camp, students must be enrolled to attend a Connecticut high school in the 2025-26 academic year and cannot have previously attended CBA Law Camp. CBA Law Camp is a one-week day camp sponsored by the Connecticut Bar Association's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee. CBA Law Camp offers students a unique opportunity to learn about the legal profession and develop critical and analytical thinking skills. During the week-long day camp, attendees will meet practicing lawyers or judges, observe court proceedings, receive advocacy training, and participate in a mock trial competition.

The CBA provides Law Camp as a community service program. There is no cost to attend. Submitting an application does not guarantee a spot in CBA Law Camp; there are a limited number of spots available. The Program Committee will make acceptance decisions based on applications by June 15. Most days, camp will be at the UConn School of Law's campus; camp may be at a court one or two days.
