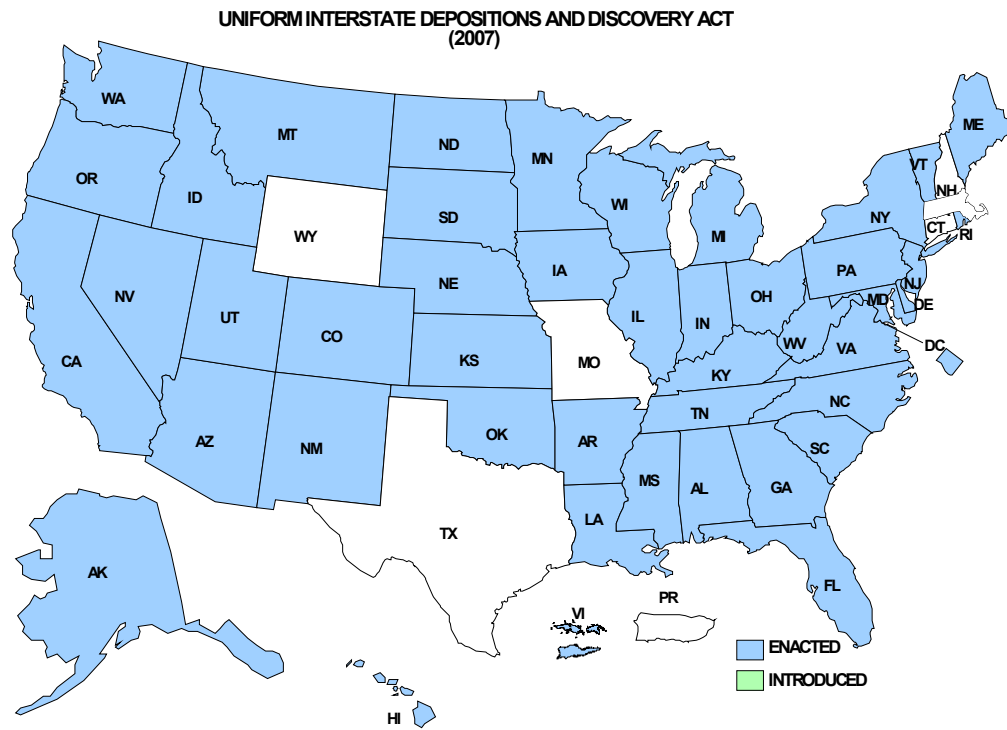




A Few Facts about  
**THE UNIFORM INTERSTATE DEPOSITIONS AND DISCOVERY ACT**

- PURPOSE:** The Uniform Interstate Depositions and Discovery Act (UIDDA) provides simple procedures for deposing individuals and for producing discoverable documents when the individual or document is located out of state.
- ORIGIN:** Completed by the Uniform Law Commission in 2007.
- APPROVED BY:** American Bar Association; included in the Council of State Governments’ Suggested State Legislation 2010, Volume 69
- ENACTED BY:** Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, U.S. Virgin Islands, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.
