These amendments were distributed to the JJPOC members via email on November 3, 2021 and again on December 21, 2021. The JJPOC has worked in partnership with the Council of State Governments and supports the recommendations of the Improving Outcomes for Youth (IOYouth) Task Force, including strategic diversion of juvenile delinquency cases from the formal court process.
