The Committee approved the minutes of the meeting held on December 13,
 with no revisions.

2. The Committee reconsidered a proposal from Judge Noble to revise the standard premises liability interrogatories (Form 203) and requests for production (Form 206) to include whether there was an agreement for snow and ice removal and the existence of contract for the same (RC ID # 2021-014).

At the December meeting, the Committee voted unanimously to submit to public hearing the proposal from Judge Noble, however, there were inconsistencies with the language in Form 206.

After discussion and minor revisions, the committee voted unanimously to submit to public hearing the proposal to revise the standard premises liability interrogatories

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(Form 203) and requests for production (Form 206) to include whether there was agreement for snow and ice removal and the existence of a contract for the same, as set forth in Appendix A, attached to these minutes.

3. The Committee considered a proposal from Faiz Siddiqui to amend Practice Book Section 36-6 regarding cancellation of arrest warrants (RC ID # 2020-014).

After discussion, the Committee voted to take no action and tabled this matter.

4. The Committee reconsidered a proposal from Judge Conway to amend Practice Book Sections 27-1A and 27-4A regarding the nonjudicial handling of certain delinquency cases to implement recommendations of the IOYouth Task Force. (RC ID # 2021-011).

After brief discussion, the Committee tabled this matter until the February meeting to give Judge Westbrook the opportunity to review the December 23<sup>rd</sup> comments from Chief State's Attorney Colangelo.

5. The Committee considered a proposed revisions to Practice Book Section 2-16, Attorney Appearing Pro Hac Vice, in conjunction with the approved changes to Practice Book 62-8A, Attorneys or Other Jurisdictions Participating Pro Hac Vice on Appeal, and revisions to the applicable forms JD-CL-141, JD-CL-143, and JD-CL-142 (RC ID # 2021-018).

Attorney James O'Connor was present and addressed the Committee on this matter.

After discussion, the Committee tabled this proposal and referred it to the Chief Court Administrator, and Attorney Jill Begemann for the Appellate Rules Committee for comments.

6. The Committee considered a proposal from the Connecticut Bar Association to amend Practice Book Section 2-44A and Rule 5.5 of the Connecticut Rules of

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Professional Conduct to provide that remote practice from Connecticut by attorneys

licensed and in good standing in other jurisdictions is not the unauthorized practice of law

(RC ID # 2021-025).

After discussion, the Committee tabled this matter until the February meeting to

allow the Statewide Grievance Committee the opportunity to consider the proposal and

to give Chief Disciplinary Counsel Brian Staines and Statewide Bar Counsel Michael

Bowler the opportunity to submit comments.

7. The Committee considered a proposal to amend the Practice Book to include

uniform standard interrogatories and production requests for real property tax appeals

(RC ID # 2021-027).

After discussion, the Committee tabled this proposal and referred it to the

Connecticut Bar Association, Connecticut Association of Assessing Officers, Connecticut

Association of Municipal Attorneys, Judge Abrams, and the presiding judge for

administrative appeals for review of the proposal and to submit comments.
