Thank you for your email today. My personal belief is that an administrative suspension of an attorney's license for failing to comply with the CLE requirement is appropriate. I do, however, think that some due process should adhere before the suspension. A lawyer who is a target of the discipline should perhaps have an opportunity to explain their situation i.e., a medical condition or another extreme hardship. I can see an argument being made against my concern; namely, the lawyer should claim an exemption before discipline takes place. This makes sense to me as well. More thought should be given as to whether any due process should be afforded.
