**Re: Proposed Amendment to Section 1-11C**

Dear Attorney Del Ciampo.

The Rules Committee requested comments from the Office of the Victim Advocate (OVA) regarding the above referenced proposal. The proposal would permit a judge to authorize camera coverage of a homicide case involving charges of sexual assault provided the victim's family affirmatively consents to such coverage.

The OVA takes the position that a victim's involvement in criminal proceedings and all related decision-making is the victim's choice. As such, I do not have an opinion as to whether this proposal benefits or harms victims, as the experience and needs of each victim varies. However, I would advise that if this amendment occurs, a process must be in place to address conflicting wishes of multiple victims. For example, in a homicide case, the parents are the victims - one parent may wish to have video coverage, while the other may not. It is important that no victim is coerced into agreement on this matter.
