Hello Andrew,

I hope you are well and you are having a good summer. I have a rules committee issue for you.

In deciding a motion for summary judgement in a negligence case, an issue arose involving whether a co-defendant is an "adverse party" for purpose of opposing a co-defendant's motion for summary judgment. Turns out that this phrase is used throughout the civil rules, and is not defined. There are a few old cases saying a co-defendant is not an adverse party and then some new ones (all superior court cases) that discuss the concept in terms of whether the co-defendant has "standing." The federal rules do not use this phrase, but are split as to whether a co-defendant can oppose another defendant's motion for summary judgment.

Anyway, I thought I would raise it with you as chair. I could send you my decision which further demonstrates the issues, but I was not sure if that would be ok, since the case could be appealed. Of course, I do not expect a response now while you are on break, but wanted to send this to you while the issue was fresh in my mind.
